From the Club Manager



f you've been to the club lately, you've probably noticed the signs of construction. We are always striving to make our club better, and we have started several projects around the clubhouse that provide additional services for our members and also help with the operations and maintenance of the facility.

The first project is the renovation of the former golf pro shop into an expanded men's locker room. Years ago a portion of the original locker room was renovated and turned into additional dining space in the Waterside Grill. Since our golf membership has grown over the years, we reached a point where a larger men's locker room was needed and the only place to expand was into the former pro shop. We hope to have this space completed by May of this year.

At the same time we are building a new storage

building in an unused area near the Adult Pool. We have needed more storage space at the clubhouse for years, and this will allow us to more efficiently operate our food and beverage and banquet activities. Once the storage area is complete, we plan to renovate some of our existing storage space into an expanded ladies' locker room, and a bride's room when we have weddings.

And last but not least, we will be having a bulkhead installed along Pecan Lake on the north side of the clubhouse. This will provide a more dramatic appearance of the club as you enter the community, and also serve to stabilize the area along the lake.

We feel all these projects will serve to improve the club for our members and guests, and we appreciate your patience as we continue to serve you during the renovations.

Finally each month we will have an article on proper golf etiquette, the rules of golf, or just golf related knowledge. . . .

Proper Green Divot Repairs

The rule of thumb should be to repair your ball mark and three others that you find on the green. Repairing those little depressions is very important. Equally important is doing it the right way. Because while many golfers fail to repair ball marks, there are also many well-meaning golfers who do "repair" the pitch marks, only to do so incorrectly.

A ball mark can cause the grass in the depression to die, leaving not just a scar but also a pit in the putting surface that can knock well-struck putts offline. Repairing a ball mark restores a smooth surface and helps keep the grass healthy. But "repairing" a ball mark incorrectly can cause more damage than not attempting to repair it at all, per a study done at Kansas State University.

The KSU researchers, whose conclusions were reported on Cybergolf.com, found that incorrectly "repaired" ball marks take up to twice as long to heal as those that are properly repaired.



Step #1:

Take your ball mark repair tool and insert the prongs into the turf at the edge of the depression. Note: Do NOT insert the prongs into the depression itself, but at the rim of the depression.



Step #2:

The next step is to push the edge of the ball mark toward the center, using your ball mark repair tool in a "gentle twisting motion." This is the step where golfers who incorrectly "repair" ball marks usually mess up. Many golfers believe the way to "fix" a ball mark is to insert the tool at an angle, so the prongs are beneath the center of the crater, and then to use the tool as a lever to push the bottom of the ball mark back up even with the surface. Do not do this! Pushing the bottom of the depression upward only tears the roots, and kills the grass.





Step #3:

Once you've worked around the rim of the ball mark with your repair tool, pushing the grass toward the center, there's only one thing left to do: Gently tamp

down the repaired ball mark with your putter smooth the putting surface.

Ensure that fairway divots are filled with the sand that is provided on the cart, or replace the divot. Do not use the sand provided in the cart on the tee, as we will come and fill these divots with a sand seed mix. Let us see you fixing your divot and THREE more!






Match Play Continues



- December 7th Annual Meeting







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DID YOU KNOW?

With so many new residents and golf members joining the country club recently, we wanted to take this opportunity to explain our food and beverage service charge policy.

aterside Srill

Most servers in the food and beverage industry are paid a small hourly wage, and the majority of their income is derived from tips. The federal minimum wage for wait staff is actually much lower than the standard minimum wage for other workers. However, unlike a normal restaurant that is open to the public, the Waterside Grill has restricted access and therefore the number of people dining in the Grill can be very unpredictable. The club has always added a service charge to all checks, which is standard in the country club industry, and in the past it went directly to the servers that were working that particular table as a tip.

However, we found it was very difficult to hire and retain staff willing to work during the off-peak hours (breakfast, lunch and some dinner shifts) because many times there are simply not enough customers to generate enough in tips to earn a livable wage.

In order to hire and retain a qualified staff to serve our members at all times, we found it was necessary to pool the service charge and spread out among the servers in the form of a higher hourly wage. This helps to ensure them of a fair income whether they were working during peak or non-peak times.

All our servers are paid an hourly wage that is much higher than the industry standard, and although the standard 18% service charge on your check does not go directly to your server for your meal, it does subsidize a higher wage rate for your server. Of course any additional tip that you choose to add to your check, does go directly to your server for that meal. While this change in compensation structure may have a higher operating cost, it has accomplished our primary objective of retaining a qualified and stable workforce to service your dining experience.
