

From the Club Manager



wanted to take this opportunity to pass along an update on the status of the Fitness Center and Golf Shop facility. Since lightning struck the building on May 3rd, the information about damage to the building seems to be changing constantly. We have tried to keep you updated along the way, but several times we drafted an update notice and before we could send it out the information had changed.

The fire damage was contained in the attic above the second floor in the building, but the additional water and smoke damage have greatly increased the scope of the repairs. At this stage contractors are having to remove a majority of the sheetrock, spray foam insulation, carpet, tile, and most of the furnishings in the facility that were damaged. As an example of the project scope, in order to get to the 20+ foot ceiling in the Golf Shop, scaffolding had to be erected in order to remove the ceiling and walls

so workers could scrape the smoke damaged spray foam insulation from the underside of the roof and the walls. We anticipate the demolition portion of the project will be complete in June. Once the damaged material is removed, a structural engineer will evaluate the damage to the building framing and make recommendations on the repairs required. We will then work as quickly as possible to get the facility repaired and available for our members and guests.

We are very proud of this facility that has been used and enjoyed by so many of our members over the past two years, and we want to restore it to its previous condition as soon as possible. We appreciate your continued patience during this process, and we will continue to update you on the status of the repairs. In the meantime, we will not be charging any Fitness dues until we can provide facilities for you to utilize.

1. 10 Push Ups
 2. 15 Squats

*Wall Push Ups or Knee Push Ups *Sit down in a chair and stand

3. 30 Mountain Climbers

*Place hands on wall or counter top instead of the ground

4. 15 Jumping Jacks

*Standing Jacks

5. 10 Walking Lunges

*Split Lunge

Workout 2: Lower Body Blast

Complete exercises 1-6. Rest 30-60 sec. and repeat for 3-4 rounds

Exercises

Modifications if needed

1. 15 Squat Jumps

*Squats

2. 15 Curtsey Lunges

3. 30 Second Wall Sit

4. 15 Right Leg Deadlifts

*Keep your left leg slightly bent

5. 15 Left Leg Deadlifts

*Keep your right leg slightly bent

6. 15 Reverse Crunches

*Keep your knees bent and tuck in towards your chest



Workout 3: Upper Body Burn

Complete Exercises 1-4 with no rest. Repeat for 3-5 Rounds

Exercises

Modifications if needed

1. 12 Push Ups

*Wall Push Ups or Knee Push Ups

2. 12 Plank Shoulder Taps

* Place your hands on a coffee table or sturdy chair

3. 12 Tricep Dips (Use a sturdy chair or side of the tub)*Bend your knees to make the level of difficulty easier

4. 12 Jumping Jacks

* Standing Jacks



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
