



Alderman Ted Case, the City's appointed Representative, attended the H-GAC's 2019 General Assembly to help select two General Law City representatives and two alternates to serve on the 2019 H-GAC Board of Director.

2019 Rules of Golf

Here is a great USGA web site that contains great information about the 2019 rule changes. Go to www.usga.org Select videos from the home page or type in 2019 rules in the search window (I got 16873 results, you decide which is better). There are boxes where you can select various rules videos including 2019 rules. Did you know when a ball drop is required when taking relief, it must be let go at knee height and it does not touch any part of the player's body or equipment? Rule 14.3.b.

Etiquette

Last month we talked about Respect for the course. The rough remains long so more work is needed on repairing our divots. We will finish part one (respect for the course) this month. Respect for the course means leaving the course as you would like to find it by repairing pitch-marks, replacing divots and raking bunkers.

Expectations: we have a beautiful golf course in Weston Lakes, but it is not Pebble Beach or Augusta National. (Nor are the green fees.) It takes months and years to prepare a course for a championship round. We play on our course through maintenance projects with little difficulty. Players must ensure they do their part in keeping the golf course in its best condition. It should not be left to Shannon and his team to keep Weston Lakes in top condition. Golfers have a role to play as well.

Unknown damage: did you know that taking practice swings on the tee box creates twisting and turning of your feet and can create significant wear and divot damage? Solution: complete your stretching and warm up swings, especially the first tee, off the box. Also, leaving your broken tee on the tee box is not respectful of the course or other golfers. Pick up your broken tee and four more.

Bunkers: Bunkers require special golfer etiquette. Please be mindful of your enter, exit, and play from bunkers to avoid causing damage or personal injury. Use the lowest point of access when entering a bunker, even if that means taking a slightly longer walk. Most important, avoid entering or exiting bunkers on steep slopes. Try to disturb as little sand as possible when walking in a bunker and use a nearby rake after your shot to smooth any footprints or imperfections that you create. After smoothing any imperfections and exiting the bunker, make sure to place the rake parallel to the line of play with the teeth oriented downward on the outside of the bunker, unless instructed otherwise. Before walking away from the bunker, knock any sand off your shoes.



Pecan Park Update - Rebuilding Texas Grant

KWLB continues to work on the beautification of Pecan Park, along with the POA, and we wanted to give Weston Lakes residents an update. KWLB has planted three 65-gallon Live Oaks in the center of the "walking trail", three 45-gallon Cypress and two 15-gallon Crepe Myrtle trees along the bank of Pecan Lake. Also, two 15-gallon Texas Olive trees were planted in the newly certified Monarch Butterfly Waystation located in Pecan Park. Texas Olive trees are a lure and natural habitat for butterflies.

By planting the new trees along the walking trail and lake banks, these trees will grow up to play an important role in our community. In addition to beautifying spaces, they will create more shade along the heavily used grounds, improve our air quality and help with drainage. As our city grows, how we maintain and develop our community impacts all the resources, people and surrounding landscape.

Finally, to improve water quality and overall aesthetics' of Pecan Park Lake, six artificial fish habitats made of recycled HDPE 5-gallon buckets and reclaimed PVC drip tubing were installed. This remediation project should also improve water circulation and habitats for fish and other aquatic animals to thrive.
