

### Garden Club

have held off on writing the monthly WL Garden Club article because of the COVID-19 pandemic. It's hard to know what to write as it's hard to know what's going to happen tomorrow much less April. It seems to me that, almost worse than the virus, is the uncertainty it engenders. It's seems like a war against an invisible foe being fought right up to our own doorsteps. There is almost no segment of the population or economy that isn't touched by a virus most of us had never heard of until about a month or so ago.

If you will indulge me, I'd like to make a garden related analogy. This way I can incorporate gardening into this article without ignoring this major disruption to our lives. There is only so much we can control in our lives and sometimes when we can't do that, we feel fearful. When we plant our gardens, we either plant seeds (if you have a lot more patience than I do) or put a plant into the ground. Most likely we have made sure the soil is good and we plan to water and fertilize appropriately. Now here's the miracle... the seeds sprout, the plants grow without us having to worry about it. We don't get up every morning and run outside to see if our plant has grown or not and that's because we expect it to. Our experience has shown us over time that we don't have to fret over what's going on with our plants. As long as we do our part, we can relax and enjoy the fruits (or flowers) of our labor.

In times like these, it's good to reflect on what we can do and then turn the rest over to God. We can wash our hands, stay home, sanitize, and disinfect for our part. As a person of faith, I believe prayer and faith go along way towards easing my concerns and fears. We never have guarantees about what exactly is going to happen in the future and, even if we knew, we don't control most of it. Many of us have fought intense personal battles such as cancer, the loss of a child, financial trouble...you name it! I've had some of these experiences and have come through it. It's easier to have faith when times are good; however, my prayer is to build up a strong reserve of faith and strength to see me through the tough times.

So, how exactly does a plant grow? Well most need sun and water and they use it to grow a flower, a pumpkin, or whatever. However, I can't tell you step by step down to the nth microscopic level what happens, and I don't need to know for it to happen. I think faith is kind of like that. For faith to grow, it needs nurturing through prayer, a relationship with our creator, study, or whatever else helps you to plant it in your heart and soul. However, if we do out part, God will do the rest and our faith will grow. I can't tell you exactly how as that's the mystery of faith.

#### The Many Ways You Can Help Improve Waterway Health

Water is an essential part of our lives. In addition to quenching our thirst, we depend on it for recreation, irrigation of our farmland, watering livestock, and to run our businesses. The job to protect water quality is complex, and we must all work together to protect and restore water resources. We encourage you to do your part and here are a few things you can do.

- Apply pesticides and fertilizers according to the label's directions and only to plants that are specified on the label. Only use the recommended amount of pesticide or fertilizer.
- 2. Use the least-toxic pesticide first.
- 3. Choose natural or organic fertilizers.
- After mowing, leave grass clippings on your lawn. These clippings act as a slow-release fertilizer for your grass.
- Plants that are native or well adapted to Texas require less pesticides and fertilizers when managed properly.
- Apply mulch around trees and shrubs, reducing the need for fertilizers.

- Most lawns receive twice as much water as they require. Watering too heavily or too rapidly weakens your lawn, causing erosion and runoff. Water that is applied too rapidly is lost as runoff, which may carry polluting fertilizers and pesticides to streams and lakes. Excess irrigation can leach nutrients deep into the soil away from the plant roots, increasing the chances of groundwater pollution.
- 1. Apply water infrequently, yet thoroughly. A general rule is to water up to one inch, once a week. When watering, always comply with your water system's restrictions.
- 2. Water in the morning to save water from being evaporated by the midday heat.
- Sprinkler systems offer an effective method for irrigation, if used properly. Use larger drops close to the ground. The water in misters can evaporate quickly.
- 4. Select grass carefully. Planting the turf grass adapted to your region that uses the least water is an effective way to reduce the need for irrigation.
- After mowing, leave grass clippings on your lawn to reduce your watering needs.
- Composting and grass cycling can reduce runoff pollution by preventing erosion, increasing the soil's ability to absorb and retain water, and reducing the need for fertilizers.
- Planting native Texas plants increases the soil's capacity to store water and reduce runoff.

- You should prepare the inside of the house for the warmer weather too.
- Schedule your air conditioning tune up to make sure it's ready for summer.
- Check around the house for any leaky faucets, clogged drains, or sweaty pipes. Check your basement for dampness.
- Check your attic for any critters that may have taken up residence over the winter, as well as for any signs of mold.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

With so many new residents and golf members joining the country club recently, we wanted to take this opportunity to explain our food and beverage service charge policy.

Most servers in the food and beverage industry are paid a small hourly wage, and the majority of their income is derived from tips. The federal minimum wage for wait staff is actually much lower than the standard minimum wage for other workers. However, unlike a normal restaurant that is open to the public, the Waterside Grill has restricted access and therefore the number of people dining in the Grill can be very unpredictable. The club has always added a service charge to all checks, which is standard in the country club industry, and in the past it went directly to the servers that were working that particular table as a tip.

However, we found it was very difficult to hire and retain staff willing to work during the off-peak hours (breakfast, lunch and some dinner shifts) because many times there are simply not enough customers to generate enough in tips to earn a livable wage.

In order to hire and retain a qualified staff to serve our members at all times, we found it was necessary to pool the service charge and spread out among the servers in the form of a higher hourly wage. This helps to ensure them of a fair income whether they were working during peak or non-peak times.

All our servers are paid an hourly wage that is much higher than the industry standard, and although the standard 18% service charge on your check does not go directly to your server for your meal, it does subsidize a higher wage rate for your server. Of course any additional tip that you choose to add to your check, does go directly to your server for that meal. While this change in compensation structure may have a higher operating cost, it has accomplished our primary objective of retaining a qualified and stable workforce to service your dining experience.


