### From the Club Manager



s the COVID 19 pandemic and related reopening efforts continue, our efforts will continue to follow CDC and government guidelines as we have since the beginning. As a staff, we thank you for your continued support as we navigate through these unprecedented times. We will continue to update you as our efforts unfold and evolve.

As I am sure you are all aware, Governor Abbott has issued a new Executive Order to begin Phase Two of Texas reopening. This order extends to restaurants being allowed to open with occupancy of 50% of the total occupancy of the building maintaining 6-foot social distancing between parties, with seating for parties of 6 or fewer people and bar counters closed. Outside seating is permissible with appropriate social distancing. Golfing standards will continue as is, but will update changes when made available.

Member and Staff safety has been, and will continue to be, our number one priority. Here are the increased precautions Food and Beverage is taking as we work towards keeping everyone safe:

- Required face coverings by all staff in contact with Members and Guests
- Increased cleaning and sterilizing in both front and back of the house

- · Daily health screening of associates
- Providing single-serve items upon request; ketchup and mustard packets, salt and pepper
- Continuous hand washing and hand sanitizing
- Limiting capacity indoor and outdoor dining, with a minimum of 6-foot chair to table distance
- · Disposable one use paper menus

During this time the golf course has seen a lot of action, everyone seems to be enjoying the great golfing weather. With the excessive play, please abide by the rules that are set by maintenance and the pro shop. The course maintenance staff will be taking some action by putting up rope in areas that are beat down to allow the grass to grow. One of the challenges to keep the course in good condition.



### Quick facts about Troop 941

- They are chartered by the First Fulshear United Methodist Church;
- They currently have over 50 active Scouts in many Patrols;
- They have 36 scouts who have achieved the rank of Eagle Scout since the troop was founded;
- Our Scouts organize a weekend camping trip every month;
- They regularly attend summer camps in various locations.

### Can You Believe Our Trees?

Weston Lakes resident Eric Krueger shares his love and knowledge of the majestic Pecan Trees in the community. Enjoy!

"Hello Weston Lakes Nature Lovers!" I make this assumption because we all live in an incredibly unique area filled with a plethora of plants and animals next to the Brazos River, which was the vital passageway for the settlers coming to colonize Texas. I know you love nature if you are willing to commute over an hour to work every day! More often than not, we are so busy we don't slow down to smell the proverbial roses (enjoy our nature). Our city is full of life. Laura and I have identified over 85 species of birds in our 14 years in the Riverwood section of Weston Lakes.

The cornerstone of our biodiverse ecosystem are the old-growth pecan trees that stand guard over our beautiful neighborhood. Our 200-year-old pecan trees rival some of the most famous trees from around the state.

The La Bahia Pecan was just a small tree when we declared independence from Santa Anna in 1836. The tree is located at a historic ferry landing where the Brazos and Navasota Rivers intersect. It is believed that a nut fell from a traveler's saddle bag because its DNA profile is from a pecan grove in Tamaulipas, Mexico. The La Bahia Pecan is over 200 years old. Another famous pecan tree is located west of Fort Worth in Weatherford (Parker County). Weatherford is home to the onetime National Champion Pecan Tree.

This beauty, located three miles from the town square, has an eight-foot diameter trunk, a 159-fiit crown spread, and is 118 feet high. Protecting these majestic trees in Weston Lakes must be one of our top priorities as a community.






