

championship match went to the 17th hole, where The Czar birdied out for 2 and 1 win. Brawny and Eric finished 6 and 5. Your players are shown below.







Mayor's Comments

ctober starts the beauty of the changing leaves in Fall! Enjoy the vibrant colors on a scenic drive on a lazy Sunday afternoon or a stroll in nature.



The census is winding down efforts as it has spent July 1 through September 3, 2020 working to ensure all are counted. In December, apportionment counts will be delivered to the President and Congress. By March 31, 2021, redistricting counts

will be sent to each state. Redrawing the legislative districts based on population change is the purpose of this information being gathered and distributed. Thank you for your participation.

When the weather forecasts show a hurricane or even threatening weather coming this way, our state, regional and county leaders begin to activate plans that have been put into place and are reworked after each incident or event. At the local level, meetings are attended by emergency management directors and coordinators in order to get educated on the upcoming event. Daily meetings are attended to get updates on the hurricane's paths. The predictions of the storms paths and intensity facilitate needed decision making. Decisions include setting up a shelter, respite area, and if evacuations, whether voluntary or mandatory, are warranted are considered.

Our CARES Act initiative has been a helpful program for the citizens of Weston Lakes. Many have been helped in paying their rent/mortgage and utilities. Many attended classes, which helped them with Zoom calls, ordering groceries online and seeing the doctor via applications on smart phones.

The Mayoral appointed Drainage Advisory Committee is comprised of volunteer citizens, some with engineering expertise, for the sole purpose of making recommendations to city council. They are tasked with finding long-term and regional approaches to mitigate flooding for the city.

Keep Weston Lakes Beautiful

overnor's Community Achievement Award Update

CONGRATULATIONS WESTON LAKES!!! We have very exciting news that Keep Weston Lakes Beautiful (KWLB) wishes to share with all our neighbors. KWLB has been working almost daily and diligently with TXDOT on the Governor's Grant of bringing money (\$110.000!) to Weston Lakes for the improvements to the specified areas to which TXDOT will allow paid improvements.

Let us start by explaining that growth in the area is moving full steam ahead. Looking to the future, a noisy FM1093 highway, intersections, schools, or commercial business can be a real burden for FM 1093 nearby property owners. As visually pleasing and insular as a yard might be, a constant roar or bustle can greatly diminish its aesthetics. Planting evergreen trees and shrubs to serve as a noise barrier can be quite effective and offer the added bonus of enhancing the beauty and privacy of our outdoor space. Noise abatement has become an important consideration for suppressing and dampening the surrounding noise from FM 1093.

Weston Lakes, as one of the 2019 winners of the Governor's Community Achievement Awards, funded by TXDOT, KWLB and our POA, and Sierra Golf Corporation are working closely with the landscape team from TXDOT to design a master plan that will incorporate both trees and shrubs into a noise barrier for acoustic buffering and promoting a native vegetation community. To be clear, TXDOT has final say on all landscape plans, and KWLB and the POA have worked closely with TXDOT representatives to meet TXDOT requirements and standards regarding this project. While KWLB had wished that it had discretion and final approval on any improvements realized by the TXDOT grant, that is simply not the reality, so KWLB has worked closely with TXDOT on approved vegetation and placement along FM1093 to best beautify our community along the FM1093 right of way controlled by TXDOT.

Having said all of that, planting trees can be one of the best "green" things you can do in and for your community. When you consider what trees do for the environment, they are pretty amazing. They provide food, homes for squirrels and birds, shade for the grass and plants below (and shade for people, too!). Trees provide the needed oxygen for the atmosphere - not to mention that trees get rid of carbon dioxide (a major greenhouse gas) in the process of releasing oxygen.

Here are a several native species, and information on what we hope will be used in the project upon approval from TXDOT:



Sycamore Tree

Sycamore - Texas Native

Considered the largest deciduous tree in North America, sycamore in Texas can exceed 100 feet in height and four feet in diameter, with a stout trunk and large, spreading limbs that create an oval or round, spreading crown. Sycamores work well in large, natural areas; because they have dense growth habits, they make excellent shade trees. Sycamore root systems are also excellent barriers to erosion.

Crape Myrtle

Perhaps the most common small landscape tree or large shrub planted in Texas is usually multitrunked with smooth limbs, grows to 20 feet tall and 15 feet wide, with mature trunks ranging from 4" to 12" in diameter. It tolerates a wide range of site conditions, including drought and slightly alkaline soils. Its annual blooming of vivid color brightens up every area it adorns. These would be used along the Westerham gate fence line.

Fun Fact: Live Oaks were once prized for their naturally curved limbs and trunk, used by shipbuilders in the 18th Century to fashion the ribs and planking of tall sailing ships, such as the USS Constitution known as "Old Ironsides." Refitting that ship in the 1980s included specialty pieces cut from live oaks in Texas that had been killed by the oak wilt fungus.

Magnolia - Texas Native

A large forest or landscape tree, reaching heights of 90 feet or more and a trunk to four feet in diameter, with a dense, pyramidal, or oval crown, with spreading branches often reaching the ground in open settings.

Fun Fact: Magnolias are an ancient genus, one of the oldest flowering plants, extending back approximately 130 million years.

Burr Oak - Texas Native

A large tree that can reach a height of 80 feet or more and a trunk diameter of five feet, with a short body and heavy branches that form an open, spreading crown of dark green foliage, and acorns that keep the squirrels pre-occupied for months.

Live Oak - Texas Native

stout trunk of four feet or more in diameter, dividing into several large, twisting limbs that form a low, dense crown that can spread more than 100 feet, with limbs often touching

Bald Cypress

Bald cypress trees can grow to a height of up to 120 feet. Their needle-like leaves grow individually from the twig. Leaves are soft and feathery in appearance, dull light green above and whitish underneath. Coneshaped "knees" project from submerged roots. The bald cypress is a deciduous (loses its leaves in fall) conifer (cone bearing tree). It is covered with brown or gray bark with long fiber-like or scaly ridges that peel off in strips. Cones are made up of several, four-angled, flattened scales. Limbs are often draped with Spanish moss.



Bald cypress trees add grace and beauty to Bald Cypress many of Texas' most cherished waterways, and offer excellent barriers to erosion, will be planted along Pecan Lake at the main entrance of Weston Lakes.

Fun Fact: A member of the Redwood family, they are among the first trees in Texas to lose their leaves in the fall (hence the name "bald cypress") and the last to bud in the spring. Most live up to 600 years, but some individuals have survived 1,200 years.

Texas Sage Shrub

A classic in the American Southwest, a Texas sage shrub is a native plant.

It provides cover for wild animals and birds and helps stabilize loose desert soils. This adaptable plant is drought tolerant and useful in areas with high heat and cold desert temperatures. It is also a landscape surprise that produces profuse lavender flowers. The plant additionally has deer

resistance and thrives in poor soil. Texas Sage can achieve six feet (2 m.) in height with a similar spread. While the grayish-green, woolly leaves are not terribly spectacular, the new wood on the plant produces copious lavender purple, magenta or white flowers. These have three fuzzy petals and a fused set below with conspicuous white anthers.



Esperanza

Esperanza (also called Yellow Bells or Yellow Trumpet Flower)

This flowering shrub is native to Texas and found growing wild on rocky slopes near San Antonio and in the Trans-Pecos region. The large tubular flowers offer a striking contrast against the dark glossy foliage and are irresistible to hummingbirds, bees, and butterflies. Plants typically begin to bloom in spring and continue through the heat of the summer.

Duranta

Duranta plant delivers scores of pale blue, white, or violet clusters for the entire growing season. The duranta has attractive evergreen foliage, and some varieties have gold or variegated leaves. A bonus is the appearance of ornamental berries in the



fall. Planted in the spring, the Duranta grows quickly in warm areas into a large shrub or small tree over the course of a few seasons.

In summation, over the next months during spring and summer 2021, you will see quite a bit of activity along FM 1093 while this project is initiated and executed. While KWLB and the POA has had input, which frankly TXDOT has respected, TXDOT makes all final decisions since the grant is awarded, and to be used, along TXDOT right of ways.

We are both encouraged and thankful for the TXDOT grant and their plans to greatly improve the FM1093 right of way that should improve all our property values and the general esthetics of our community.






