PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION

POAs are private associations that oversee and manage neighborhood common areas and amenities as well as ensuring that property owners obey the Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs), By-Laws and any other governing documents. The primary purpose of a POA is to provide a safeguard for owners' property values. POA dues are assessed to provide ongoing maintenance and improvement of neighborhood amenities. A voluntary board of directors is elected by fellow property owners to make decisions on the property owners' behalf.

In Weston Lakes, membership in the Property Owners Association is a requirement of ownership. The WL POA has more extensive common property than many other POAs and maintains and improves these common areas for an annual fee that is lower than many nearby neighborhoods. Where does the money go? Restricted entry into Weston Lakes is a major attraction for property owners. To manage this restricted entry, the POA has five entry and/or exit gates, with equipment, hardware, and software that must be maintained and updated. There are personnel costs as the main gate at FM 1093 is manned 24x7 and includes three entry lanes and the west (Reserve) gate is manned from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. WL POA is responsible for over 36 miles of privately owned streets that require ongoing repairs and maintenance. The POA maintains and improves four parks, Oxbow and Pecan Lakes, a historic

cemetery, entries into various areas, and the signage, fencing, and landscaping associated with all of this. What are CC&Rs and Bylaws, and where do I find them? CC&Rs are the Declaration of Covenants. Conditions, and Restrictions that set out the rules of the POA community. They describe the requirements and limitation of what you can do with your property. The goal of the CC&Rs is to protect, preserve, and enhance property values in the community. The bylaws govern how the POA operates, such as frequency of meetings, elections, and duties of board members. Additional Rules & Regulations include other rules not covered in CC&Rs and Bylaws such as park hours and gate entry requirements. The Weston Lakes POA website https://westonlakespoa.com provides ready accessibility to these documents under "Resident Documents." Questions regarding these documents can be addressed by emailing wlonsite@ westonlakespoa.com or stopping by the POA office.

The POA will be addressing some of the common areas and performing pressure washing and other maintenance this month. Some of these areas include Waterford (outside) wall and Monuments, the Entryway of the Front Gate, the Reserve entryway, the East Gate monuments, the Oxbow Monuments, the Villas Monuments and Lake Village. Painting will also be performed on the piping at Brazos River Park! If you see people working in these areas please drive slowly!



The area near the birds' water feature is designed to offer birds an attractive spot to stop for food, water, and rest. It features a pondless stream, native birdattracting plants, and feeders. It allows visitors close-up viewing of birds. Following a few standard bird viewing area rules will help everyone have the opportunity to enjoy the tranquility of nature and to watch and listen to the birds.

- Keep as quiet as you can, step away to chat.
- Avoid unnecessary movement. Sudden movement scares the birds away.
- Dogs must be on leash and preferably kept away from the viewing area.
- Authorized volunteers only inside of the roped area.

KWLB started off the season with lots of action! Volunteers made the Butterfly Garden and the Bird Sanctuary start to shine for Spring visitors. They were busy trimming, mulching, cleaning bird feeders, and adding duck boxes! Everyone in the neighborhood can volunteer when the call for a workday goes out and join in the fun and satisfaction of beautifying the parks for all the enjoy.
