An unrepaired ball mark takes two weeks to heal, a repaired ball mark only takes three days to heal. Thank you for your help with this issue. Hope to see you on the course, and as always please repair your ball marks.


The season-long points race is heating up! Let's take a look at the right of our top 20 as of completion of Lone Ranger:

September is a great time to garden...from your air conditioned couch! Evaluate your existing garden, what thrived and what didn't, and start planning next year's gardens considering a few key points. Think native plants, there's a reason they survived throughout history without our help. Also, consider plants designated as Texas Superstars that are proven to perform well in our tough growing conditions. Buy plants that will do well in our planting zone of 9a/b. When planning your beds consider the requirements of the plants. Do they like shade, full sun, moist soil, for example. With these factors in mind you will **reduce your time, energy, and money** in addition to having a beautiful garden.


